The May hike will be in scenic Savage Eulf on a new trail constructed by the Dept. of Conservation as a part of the South Cumberland Recreation Complex. Trail Supervisor Bob Richards will be the leader. We meet at 10 a.m. Central Daylight Time at Ranger Gray's headquarters 4 miles north of Palmer off State Highway 108 or 9 miles south of Cagle off Highway 8. Watch for signs. Route 8 runs southeast from McMinnville and Route 108 connects with SR 27 near Whitwell, northwest of Signal Mountain. There will be scenic viof Savage Gulf, wildflowers and large, outstanding trees. Bob says wear shoes and carry a lunch and a canteen. The hike is 6 to 7 miles long.

The Nashville Chapter will sponsor a hike May 28 on the old Stagecoac Road/old Lebanon Birt road near Mt. Juliet. This route is part of an early pioneer trail from the "wilderness" of Virginia and the Carolinas west to the historic Eagle Tavern and Nashville. This trail was travelled by Andrew Jackson, Tames K. Polk, John Bell, Sam Houston and other men of history. Meet at 9:00 a.m. CDT at the Walfle Shop, I-40 and Old Hickory Blvd, between Nashville and Lebanon. This will be a leisurely 5-mile hike. We will begin at Carver's Gap and hike along the AT over the crest of the rhododendron-covered balds to Highway 19-E. The views are spectacular and the rhodendron should be in full bloom. The 12,000 acres that will surround us are the target lands for purchase by Southern Angalachian Highlands Conservancy to conserve their beauty as it is."
