#### COHUTTA WILDERNESS BACKPACKING 5-6 June, 1982

Moderate to strenuous. We will hike the Horseshoe Bend Trail down to the Jacks River Trail then upstream to Rice Camp Trail and back out. The hike will be approximately 10 miles. There are spectacular views of the Jacks River and surrounding mountains from Horseshoe Bend Trail. We will cross the Jacks River 13 times and eat lunch at beautiful Jacks River Falls. Along Rice Camp Trail we will follow Rice Camp Branch with brook trout found in its little pools. I'll be camping Friday night where the Conasauga and Jacks River join right at the northwestern border of the Cohutta's on the Georgia-Tennessee line. To get here go east of Cisco on Ga. 2, the paved road by the church, for approximately 8 miles to the rivers. We will start hiking Saturday at 10 a.m. Eastern time. Meet at the camping area.

# PINSON MOUNDS ARCHAELOGICAL AREA 26 June, 1982

Join the Memphis chapter on a fascinating hike through the Pinson Mounds State Archaeological Area near Jackson, TN. Leader Steve Pardue will introduce trekkers to the area, which contains the sixth largest group of Indian burial mounds in the United States. Pinson Mounds is filled with artifacts left by woodland Indians as far back al 10,000 years ago. Hikers will walk among ceremonial mounds, earthworks, excavation sites, and the second tallest mound in the


## **Memphis**
