TENNESSEE ENVIRONMENTAL COUNCIL

The TEC Board met on January 7 and several serious decisions were made in order to keep this important environmental organization alive at a time in history when we need this protection more than ever before. With the lack of incoming grant money, TEC can no longer keep its present paid staff. The Board decided to terminate two positions, those held by Betsy Loyless and Polly Wiley, and to cut Ruth Neff's position to half-time. In order to further cut expenses, it was decided to move TEC's office on Jan 29-30 into the Tennessee Conservation League's office and share expences with them. The TEC Board and other volunteers will assume more responsibilities in order to keep this excellent organization viable. Volunteers are needed for: assistance in

preparing mailings; help in moving the office on January 29-30. They have books and papers they will be unable to store, so a help with this move may bring you a bonus. Also needed are donations of money (tax deductible) from individuals or organizations. Grab your long johns and join us at Fall Creek Falls State Park for a moderately difficult winter overnighter on the Cumberland Plateau. The hike will be approximately 12 miles, five on Saturday and seven on Sunday. The weather in January on the Plateau is raw and unforgiving so layer up warmly. Bring lots of carbos and quick energy foods to provide warmth and energy, and several water bottles to keep hydrated. We will be on the Lower Loop of the Cane Creek Overnight Trail which goes down into Cane Creek Gulf, and passes by Piney Creek Falls, Fall Creek Falls. The Gulf is magnificent in winter with many large Eastern Hemlock, a-d the frozen falls are unforgettable. Don't forget your camera. Meet at 9:30a.m. Central time in the Nature Center at Fall Creek Falls State Park.



ESPERANZA TRAIL HIKE 12 Feb., 1983
