Many of you may not know TTA is an organizational member of TEC. We are one of 42 organizations under the TEC umbrella. TEC has served us well over the years by monitoring state government, representing environmental interests in discussions of environmental protection, and keeping us posted of events, issues, and opportunities. TEC does important work. This past year, the Governor's Safe Growth Team.adopted many of the proposals put forth by TEC. TEC has played a role in the development of the deep well injection regulations. They helped with efforts to reauthorize the Endangered Species Act and to defend the Clean Air Act. TEC will work with the state to develop a protection plan for the Collins Scenic River.

TEC is presently trying to increase its membership. NATIONAL TRAILS BILL PASSES--The president signed into law on March 28 the National Trails System Act, S.271. The bill amends the National Trails System Act to include three new National Scenic Trails. The Florida Trail, Potomac Heritage Trail, and the Natchez Trace

SPRING IN THE FOREST APRIL 30-MAY 1

Spring has sprung in the Forest at Shelby Forest State Park and the celebration will begin April 30 at 7:30 a.m. until sundown May 1. Celebration events will include wildflower walks, forest ecology hikes, aquatic boat tours, raptors demonstrations, southern folklore, to name just a few. All activities will begin at the Park's Recreation Lodge on Sat. and the Interpretive Center on Sun. exhibits at the Rec Lodge will include the Sierra Club Audubon, TTA, Wildflower Society, and Environmnetal improvement Comm. Trail were added to the system, bringing the total of national scenic trails to 10. The Natchez Trace Trail will run through Alabama, Mississippi, and Tennessee. In addition to creating new trails, the law grants additional authorities to the federal agencies to assist volunteer groups, like TTA, in development, maintenance and management of trails.

BEARWALLER GAP NATIONAL RECREATION TRAIL

JACK'S RIVER FALLS - MARCH 19, 1983

Although rain seemed imminent, it did not dampen the spirits of the 9 hikers who started out from the meeting place in Chattanooga for Jack's River Falls. By the time we joined an additional 7 hikers at the junction of Highway 64 and 411, it was turning into a promising day. A convoy of 5 cars made the trek up a winding mountain road to the Beech Bottom parking area (which has been relocated and can accommodate more cars-has gravel too!) The 3-1/2 miles to the falls is an easy walk but the scenery is magnificent--hemlocks and beeches, rhododendron almost as high as the trees in places, and the the cascades over the rocks in the streams make it seem like the Smokies. Lunch at the falls was a special treat--the sun was peeking out, the water was thundering over the falls, and the spray was very refreshing. We met quite a few backpackers on our way out--we all wished we had brought our packs so we could stay in one of the beautiful campsites along the river. River from high bluffs. Wild tunkeys crossing the road near us and trilium growing along the trail made up for some of the discomfort from the cold and rain.
