The Cumberland Trail Conference's 12th annual Break-Away has come to a close. This Break-Away was certainly different than the last 4 Break-Away programs. As many of you know, the trail building emphasis has shifted from the Soddy-Daisy area to the northern corridor of the Cumberland Trail near Caryville. The goal is to complete the Smoky Mountain segment of the CT which would connect Cove Lake and Frozen Head State Parks with one continuous trail. Besides a short segment of trail built during Big Dig 2006, this section of the CT has not had any new trail built since 2001. In addition this Break-Away had another twist; during the week of March 12-16 a second Break-Away took place near Crossville. Therefore, as you can imagine, many logistic issues had to be worked out and with the tremendous assistance of TTA volunteers and others all of the pieces of the puzzle fell into place and this Break-Away was a huge success. Break-Away 2007 produced many accomplishments. In the north, 253 students. 10 Americorp members, 23 trail volunteers, state park personnel, and CTC staff built approximately 4 miles of trail in 18 days totaling 8400 volunteer hours. In support of this trail building effort, 8 volunteers assisted the kitchen staff and 4065 meals were provided. This building effort almost completed the link up of trail from the New River north to completed trail at Green's Branch. In Crossville, 45 students, 19 trail volunteers, and CTC staff built approximately 1.5 miles of trail in 4 days totaling 1800 volunteer hours on the trail. Numerous volunteers supported this trail building effort by cooking and providing 750 meals. This endeavor completed the re-route of the trail on the western slope of Black Mountain down to Windless Cave.

As I stated earlier none of this would have been possible without the help of the various TTA chapters and their membership. I am sure all of the chapters assisted in some way whether it was through the proceeds of the annual auction, money and food donated during the Break-Away program, kitchen and other logistic support, or TTA members coming out and getting dirty by helping to build the trail. Without this support, all of the accomplishments of Break-Away 2007 would not have been possible and I want to say thank you. However, I ask that we do not stop with these accomplishments and we keep the momentum going. Big Dig 2007 is on the horizon, May 10-June 30, and I ask all TTA members to help support it. We will be based out of Stony Fork School near Caryville. This school was closed in the summer of 2005 and is still in good condition. It has water, electricity, a cafeteria, hot showers, and air conditioned rooms. The citizens of Stony Fork are excited about it being used which is good public relations for the trail. All that is needed are volunteers. Will you help complete the Smoky Mountain segment and bring Tennessee's 53rd state park and the vision of the TTA founders another section closer to completion? Thank you, Tony

May 5 Cumberland Trail, Smoky Mountain Segment: Continuing our exploration of the northern part of the CT, and as a prelude to the CTC's Spring Trail Building on the Smoky Mtn. Segment this year, we'll day hike part of the CT above Caryville to Montgomery Fork. About 7 miles roundtrip out and back with an option to hike farther, if the group wants, toward the current end of the existing trail. May 20th: Clear Creek Trail (Historic Hike) Norris, Tennessee This is a scenic and pristine walk in the Norris watershed through hardwood forests populated by songbirds, deer, and wild flowers. This area was the former site of the town of Peril. We will see where electricity was generated at the turn of the 20th century (decades before TVA), and visit an historic cemetery. You'll be surprised to learn that a chair factory and mill operated here. Nature has reclaimed all traces of this early settlement. The hike begins from the Norris pumping station on Lower Clear Creek Rd and runs about 2.5 miles along and across Clear Creek with several historic markers and sites along the way. The hike is about 5 miles round trip of mostly level terrain, although there is a hill going up to the old Red Hill Church cemetery. Bring water, waterproof your boots, and bring your camera. This is a nice relaxing walk next to a beautiful stream with a history lesson combined. **Directions:** Going north from Knoxville on I-75, take Exit 122 (Norris/Clinton). Turn right on Hwy. 61, travel past the Museum of Appalachia, and turn left (north) on Hwy. 441 toward Norris Dam. Travel 4 miles to the Lenoir Museum and turn right at the Grist Mill onto a gravel road (Clear Creek Rd) and follow it for approximately one mile. Turn left just past the water tank and then right into the parking area.

May 12 – Walls of Jericho, Tennessee/Alabama line The Walls of Jericho is a large, bowl-shaped natural amphitheater that is part of more than 21,000 acres of rivers, forested uplands and caves spreading across the Alabama and Tennessee state line acquired by the Nature Conservancy. The hike is about 4 miles in length, one way, and is downhill most of the route into the gorge. It is a strenuous hike, so wear comfortable shoes and bring plenty of water, lunch, and snacks. The trail is well marked but often is muddy for days after a rain shower. Several streams have to be crossed, so either bring a second pair of river shoes or plan on getting a little wet. The driving time from Crossville is a little over 2 hours. The hiking time will be about five hours. Meet at the Tractor Supply in Crossville at 7 am CDT to carpool. May 19 - Cloudland Canyon, Rising Fawn, Georgia (Northwest Georgia)Located on the western edge of Lookout Mountain, this is one of the most scenic parks in Georgia, offering rugged geology and beautiful vistas. The park straddles a deep gorge cut into the mountain by Sitton Gulch Creek, and elevation differs from 800 to 1,980 feet. The hike along the West Rim and Waterfalls Trail includes a 600-step staircase on the way to two waterfalls cascading over layers of sandstone and shale into pools below. The total hiking distance will be about five miles and about three to four hours in length. The driving time from Crossville is a little over 2 hours. Bring water, lunch, and snacks. Have you considered ...maintaining a particular trail or section of trail?

Through the cooperation of land managers, who periodically inform us of volunteer opportunities, TTA can put you in touch with several Adopt-A-Trail programs, or offer suggestions on how to approach local land managers in your area.

The Adopt-A-Trail program is quite simple and flexible. Volunteers or chapters select the trail they wish to adopt and at the same time determine the level of trail maintenance they wish to undertake. Their only commitment is to hike, inspect, and report on the trail's conditions and maintenance needs twice per year. Light trail maintenance (clipping, pruning, trash and minor blow-down removal) is encouraged during each inspection. Serious trail problems identified will be reported to the local land management agency for resolution.
