Wild & Scenic Environmental Film Festival Stopping in Knoxville Tuesday, March 24

What started 25 years ago to bring awareness and protection to the Yuba Watershed in Nevada City, California, has transformed into a congregation of environmental activists and professionals, filmmakers, and celebrities, dedicated to saving our increasingly threatened planet. Through the grassroots efforts of the South Yuba River Citizen's League (SYRCL), the Wild & Scenic Environmental Film Festival (W&SEFF) was created. The W&SEFF is the largest environmental film festival in the United States; held annually the second week of January in Nevada City, CA. Immediately after the Festival, the "Film Festival On Tour" show travels to cities throughout the US.

Through the lenses of these leading filmmakers, one can experience the adrenalin of kayaking the wildest rivers, climbing the highest peaks, and trekking across the globe with adventure films from around the world. These environmental and adventure films illustrate the Earth's beauty, the challenges facing our planet, and the work communities are doing to protect the environment.

The "Film Festival On Tour" makes its only stop in Tennessee in downtown Knoxville on Tuesday, March 24 at 7:00 p.m. (ET) at the Square Room located in the Historic Market Square district. The Square Room is housed in the rear of the 4 Market Square Building. Tickets are \$12 in advance, \$15 on the day of the event and available now through the Tennessee Clean Water Network (TCWN) office by calling 865-522-7007 ext. 102; or you can order tickets online at www.tcwn.org. TCWN organizes Tennesseans to claim our right to clean water and healthy communities by fostering civic engagement, building coalitions and advancing water policy for a sustainable future.

Banff Mountain Film Festival World Tour Coming to Middle TN March 30, 2009

Want to watch some serious Eco-adventure films? Films that feature a broad cross-section of styles and themes; including climbing, skiing, kayaking, adventure, culture and the environment? Banff Mountain Film Festival's World Tour is coming to Nashville on Monday, March 30, 2009. For thirty-three years the Banff Mountain Film Festival (BMFF) has been celebrating the spirit of adventure and the mountain environment.

Each November, the world's best films on mountain (and outdoors) themes draw an international audience to the town of Banff, Canada, located in the Canadian Rockies. Then around twenty years ago, BMFF began an outreach program to extend the festival to other communities and to people who cannot make the annual trek to the Canadian Rockies. Festival organizers wanted to showcase the efforts and talents of the world's finest mountain filmmakers. Today, the best films from each year's festival go on tour immediately following the three-day event in Banff.

The BMFF tour makes its only stop in Tennessee at the Pascall Theater on the campus of Montgomery Bell Academy (4001 Harding Road; Belle Meade) in West Nashville on Monday, March 30 at 7:00 p.m. (CT). Tickets may be purchased now for \$10 per person at Blue Ridge Mountain Sports (615-356-2300) located at 108 Page Rd in Belle Meade. On the night of the show, expect to pay \$12 per person. Please note, seating is limited at the Pascall Theater and due to the popularity of this event it is wise to purchase the tickets ahead of time. 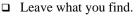

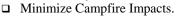

This hike will be on the new trails including the Millenium Trail and is about 4 miles with a casual pace. There are some hills so the rating is moderate. In Memoriam - Faith Dippold

"If Faith can do it, then I can do it" seemed to be the unspoken motto among the members of the Cove Lake Chapter of TTA. In speaking with several original members of our group, Faith Dippold was named as the force that led to the creation of our chapter in the late 1990s. Quite simply, from what was told, it seemed that Faith had read about the Cumberland Trail and asked a friend, Arlene Decker, to show her the trail section in Campbell County. The rest is history. Several friends from the First Presbyterian Church in La Follette met with Faith at Cove Lake State Park and began discussing plans to form a new chapter of the Cumberland Trail Association. And so, the Cove Lake Chapter of TTA was created, first meeting in the basement of the Presbyterian Church and later moving into the La Follette Recreation building.

Like all new organizations, the chapter experienced leadership changes in its early years. But, one determined, often head-strong woman seemed to keep the unit intact: Faith Dippold. Faith was committed to the Cumberland Trail and was always the First to support any activities that furthered the development of the trail. Sometimes to a fault, she pushed and prodded others to become involved with trail activities. She loved trail maintenance and especially loved working with the college students who came to work during the BreakAway weeks. She said that the students kept her young and she enjoyed their enthusiasm.

The Cumberland Trail was indeed big in Faith's heart and she committed herself to all CTC events. The saying, "If you want something done, ask a busy person," proved true with Faith Dippold. She gave a lot: organist of her church; involvement in Food Life Services: Campbell County's Habitat for Humanity: HAVEN; the Cove Lake Hiking Club; the Cumberland Trail construction; and, the Community Garden. She personally took the responsibility to oversee the maintenance of the La Follette Nature Trail. It was on that trail that Faith spent her last day doing what she loved best...making the trail beautiful for those who shared her love of nature. We will all miss Faith; and, we will not forget the commitment to the many projects that she loved.
