It's almost time! Join TTA at the 19th Annual Allardt Pumpkin Festival!! Come for a day, or enjoy the whole weekend of fun-filled events surrounding the traditional Giant Pumpkin Weigh-off Competition.

Take the left side, which puts you on Hwy 100. Go approx 1.8 miles and turn left into the grey stone entrance. Drive to the end/t-intersection (approx 1 mile) – you're in Deep Well. If on Hwy 100 and you reach Old Hickory Blvd, you've gone too far. For additional information, call Diane Manas at 615-352-7777.

The last 100 feet of the climb is through Maude's Crack. There are relics of an early 20th century settlement along No Business Creek. The side trip to the John Muir Overlook is a steep climb. The hike is about 8.5 miles and is rated moderate to strenuous because of the rugged terrain, a stream crossing, and two several hundred foot climbs. Bring snacks, water, lunch, and hiking boots.
