The Cumberland Trails Conference has been busy this year! The CTC has compiled multiple events that engage the community in what we do. Our monthly volunteer events have always been one of our top priorities. We love having the community help us build the trail, and it makes a massive impact on our productivity. Our annual volunteer hours are up to 2,557 hours! We are trying to get to 3,000 hours by the end of the year. We created a new event called the Cumberland Trail Summit, which will be hosted in a new trail town each year, with a focus on outdoor recreation within the Cumberland Trail State Park. We partnered with a multitude of organizations to bring you educational presentations, guided hikes, and adventure-packed excursions like pontoon boat rides and guided rock climbing. Don't worry if you missed this year's CT Summit. We will be hosting it in Hamilton County next year! Mark your calendars for our annual Wildflowers & Wonders art auction on April 13, 2024. We collect donated nature-themed art from locals and even renowned artists like Brent

Sanders. All proceeds go into our trail-building efforts. Each year, the art auction will be hosted in the beautiful Trinity Chapel in Dayton, TN.

Now, the information you all have waited for: our trail-building success story! Our trail crew has constructed over 11,700 feet of new trail in just over six months! This new segment of trail will tie into the Piney River Management Area upon completion. The terrain of this segment has proven to be a challenge, consisting of over 900 stone steps and pavers built just this year. That does not include the trail construction we completed last year for this segment. We also completed a one-mile section of trail on Highway 30 that will tie Graysville Mountain to Laurel Snow SNA when it is finished. As of now, the trail ends at an overlook where you can see Buzzard Point across the gorge. This segment is not currently open, as there is no trailhead or trailblazing. In addition to these segments, we also added a new trail in Laurel Snow SNA between Snow Falls Trail and Morgan Creek Bridge, though the trail ends at the bridge and is not yet blazed. Our trail crew has been working hard this year to try to get the trail constructed in its entirety, adding additional footage each week, so you can attempt a thru-hike!


