The president, Joe Gaines, said he had asked Bob Brown, TTA member who is an investment counselor at Third National Bank, Nashville, to handle the investment account. A motion was passed to allow Mr. Brown to invest the money to receive the best return.

A motion was passed to increase individual dues from \$5 to \$8 and sustaining membership from #10 to \$15. The membership will vote on the matter at the annual meeting.

Terry Bonham, state trails administrator, gave a summary of work on the trails. He said Section 2 of the Cumberland Trail, from Cove Lake to Oliver Springs, would be complete and open in about a month. On the Trail of the Lonesome Pine, the north section is almost complete, with only two problem parcels left to aquire a right-of-way across.

Mr. Bonham said the state has acquired the Tweetsie railroad rightof-way in Carter County between Elizabethton and Roan Mountain State Park. The Over Mountain Trail will follow the unique gorge as a hiking and bicycle section, with overnight site. It follows the Doe River 3-1/4 miles.

The president said he would submit an amendment to the bylaws to make TTA an educational organization.

Joe Gaines, Bertha Chrietzberg and Diane Davidson will serve as nominating committee for new officers.

The president invited suggestions from members for the annual TTA Award.

Plans were made for the annual meeting, to be held Oct. 17-18-19 at Camp Ocoee, Cherokee National Forest. Tentatively, two nights' lodging, with five meals, including Friday evening, will cost \$20, with four meals \$18, with camping \$3.50 per night, and possibly giving campers
