The nominating committee composed of Pat Anderson, chairman, Evelyn Tretter, Betty Porter and J. T. Jones, submitted the following slate of officers, who were approved by the board.: president, Jerri Bull; vice president, Tom Sheppard; corresponding secretary-treasurer, Dot Lingerfelt; recording secretary, Evelyn Tretter; director-at-large, Bertha Chrietzberg. Overlooked was a director to fill the unexpired term of Jerri Bull. Betty Porter was nominated at the general membership meeting.

A motion was passed to designate a second signer on TTA checks.

The matter of a new brochure was postponed.

A motion was passed to increase the dues beginning in 1991. Amount was not designated.

A motion was passed to join the environmental ^{Action} ~~Protection~~ Fund, which pays an environmental lobbyist at the legislature.

James Leininger, Adopt-a-Trail chairman, reported he has designed a new form for adopters to use in reporting on their inspections.

Bob Richards, state parks recreation planner and liaison with the trails community, spoke to the group about the status of trails in the state budget. He recommended that restoration of the position of trails administrator be pushed by the association. He suggested that the association might use some of its funds to pay trail workers, saying some way could be found for the state to accept these funds.
