The president, Bob Barnett, said the nominating committee reported that all present officers had agreed to stand for election for 1993.

Bob Barnett, who represents TTA on the Environmental Action Fund, report on recent activities. He agreed to discuss with the EAF board a suggestion made by Bob Richards, state parks recreational planner, that the Cumberland Trail be made a lobbying issue, in an effort to get part of the state parks budget applied to restoring the position of ranger for the CT, and his assistants.

Bob Richards reported on the National Trails Council Symposium, held this year at Missoula, Montana, which he had attended, financed in part by TTA.

The president said chapter chairmen and others should tell new members to put their phone numbers on their TTA membership applications.

A motion was passed to change the annual meeting time to an earlier date, second or third week in October, depending on accommodations being available, beginning with the 1994 meeting.
