Murfreesboro - Sara Pollard

We had three backpacking trips that were well attended: Hidden Passage in Pickett State Park, North Chickamauga section of the Cumberland Trail, and Frozen Head State Park. Day hikes included a joint hike with the Clarksville chapter at Radnor Lake, Sewanee Perimeter Trail and Welch's Point near Sparta. Our annual Good Friday hike with the Highland Rim chapter took place at Frozen Head State Park and we had hikers from four chapters to attend. Our chapter supported two events at Edgar Evins State Park: the 15th Annual Waterfall Tour and 8th Annual Celebration of Spring. These events are organized by the Friends of Edgar Evins State Park. The chapter meeting for February was cancelled due to inclement weather. Beekeepers Susan and Donnie Welchance are rescheduled for a later meeting. March guest speaker was Rick Lausten of the Columbia chapter who shared his 286 mile hike on the Pembrokeshire Coastal Path in Wales. In April Jacqueline Kelley presented her experiences walking the entire Natchez Trace Parkway. We are meeting in May to plan hikes for July-December 2016.

Nashville - Doug Burroughs

Chapter membership is 88 as of April 2016. This is an increase of 6 since the last quarterly report. Our Chapter Officers are: Chair, Doug Burroughs; Treasurer, June Callahan; Hike Coordinator, Nancy Juodenas, Programs Coordinator, Nora Beck, Amy Sutton continues to collect the statewide TTA mail from the Melrose Post Office mailbox and process as needed. Membership applications/renewals are forwarded to the Membership Director, etc. Ten hikes were scheduled and published in the TTA Newsletter, they were: Percy Warner Park (2); Beaman Park; Stones River Greenway; Polly Branch Trail (Bridgestone/Firestone Centennial Wilderness); Virgin Falls Trail; Long Hunter State Park; Natchez Trace State Park; Montgomery Bell State Park; and a Nashville Urban Hike. The Nashville Chapter continues to meet the 4th Tuesday of each month at the REI store in Brentwood TN, except for May (Annual Picnic at Warner Park) and December (Annual Holiday Party). Recent monthly meeting topics were: Pictured Rocks National Lakeshore backpack trip in Michigan (presentation was in January); Pembrokeshire Coastal Path in Wales, Day Hiking Inn to Inn (in February) and in March, Steve Ward (the Park's Director) talked about Radnor Lake State Natural Area. On April 23, 2016 (after the reporting period), the Nashville Chapter co-organized a booth at the Nashville Earth Day Celebration in Centennial Park, with Nora Beck, representing CTC. The Nashville Chapter continues to collate, label, fold, tab, stamp and mail out the printed copies of the TTA Newsletter each month. This process is coordinated by Diane Manas.

Our membership is staying steady at 60. We hiked every Wednesday and at least two Saturdays per month with hikes in Big South Fork NRRA, Cumberland Trail SP, Great Smoky Mountains NP, Frozen Head SP, Virgin Falls SNA, Savage Gulf SNA, Pickett SP, Standing Stone SP, and Sewanee University of the South. This year's overnight trip was a 3 day hike adventure in April staying in Maggie Valley, NC and hiking three trails in the North Carolina side of the Great Smoky Mountains NP. We are planning a National Trail's Day hike on the Cumberland Trail's new Hebbitsburg section.

Evan Means Small Grants & Projects - Bob Richards

Bob Richards reported that the CTC requested an Evan Means Grant for the upcoming Big Dig event <attached>. The amount requested was for \$2,500 to cover transportation expenses for the Ditch Witch to include fuel, spare tracks, and to stock replacement parts. That total came to approximately \$1,500. The other \$1,000 would be used to cover further unspecified Big Dig expenses. A motion to approve the Evan Means Grant request by CTC was made by Sara Pollard, seconded by Donna Pyers. The Board requested from Rob Weber that future requests detail all expenses to be noted so all questions are answered via the grant request. Motion carried.

CTC Update - Rob Weber

Two trail update reports were circulated by email prior to the meeting <attached>; they are: Spring BreakAway 2015 Office Report, and a Central Trail Crew BreakAway 2016 letter sent to Justin P. Wilson. Rob Weber updated us on the Spring Breakaway event. Combined, the TTA/Justin P. Wilson Grant, student revenues, and money received from TTA's 2015 Annual Meeting is projected to cover the monies spent this year. 7.2 miles of trails will be finished by June as a result and the last 2-3 miles are in various stages of completion. The next project will be 8.2 miles along the west side of Daddy's Creek immediately south of Devil's Breakfast Table. Bob Richards made a motion to allocate the remaining \$50,000 from the Ann Potter Wilson Foundation donation to the CTC. Seconded by Bruce Whitehead. Motion carried.

Bob Richards provided an update on the Gator Bridge Project. He announced the prefab bridge has been designed and will last approximately 50 years. The Company is even going to install the Pilot Bridge which might be McGill Creek near Dayton.

TTA By-laws - Bruce Whitehead

Bruce Whitehead stated that due to distances between committee members, progress was slow. Carolyn Miller provided a solution using a conference call option that she has access to. Bruce will explore this and hopefully start back on track using this method. Jim Poteet expressed concerns for a template by-law system that was sent to the members and suggested areas we should be concerned with. This will be addressed in future discussions. Due to time constraints with getting a by-laws change introduced to the membership prior to the October 2016 Annual Membership Meeting, the by-laws template will have a completion date for the 2017 Annual Membership Meeting.

Website Committee Update -

One meeting took place in February. Getting everyone together at the same time has been a challenge (especially since committee members are from all over the state). Topics discussed included software updates, design issues, and different options offered through contracts with vendors. Jim Poteet stated that he would like to see a system that, once it was designed, he could transfer responsibility for Website maintenance.

VIPs and the Newsletter -

Some updates have been done but more are needed. Discussion centered around who should receive VIP status. Suggestions included but are not limited to all legislators, businesses and entities in each community, sports stores and outfitters, state parks and newspapers. It was suggested that each chapter should review the membership list and or suggest VIP recipients. It was generally agreed that VIP recipients should receive the email version of the newsletter.

Membership Directory -

The Directory will be ready for the printer around mid-June. Members should have the option to indicate how they would like to receive their copy of the Directory — be it via snail- or e- mail. Due to the cost of approximately \$1 in postage for each Directory mailed, it was suggested that Chapter Chairs receive them and distribute them. Another suggestion was to distribute them at the Annual Meeting.

Annual Meeting Update - Charlie Bright (absent)

Charlie Bright could not attend meeting due to home flooding issues. Everything is on track so far. The issue of the Auction as a fund raiser was discussed. Should we have one or not? It was decided to consult with Charlie and decide later. One suggestion was to continue the silent auction and have members make donations rather than bid in an auction.

National Trails Day - Bob Richards

National Trails Day this year is on Saturday, June 4. Bob Richards asked the TTA to consider sponsoring the Tennessee Greenways and Trails. He was asked to make sure any proposal be written and a dollar figure enumerated. A suggestion was also made to make this a budget item in the future.

New Business

CTC Obed Wild and Scenic Area - Rob Weber

Rob Weber is seeking contacts anybody might have near the Obed Wild and Scenic Area to assist with the next phase of the the projects.

The next Board meeting was set for Saturday, July 30, 2016 at REI in Brentwood TN. The start time will be 1:00 pm Central Time.

A motion to adjourn the TTA Board of Directors' meeting was made by Bob Richards, seconded by Bruce Whitehead. Motion carried. Meeting adjourned at 3:07 pm.

DESCRIPTIONS FOR EVAN MEANS GRANT APPLICATION OF 2016

BRIEF HISTORY OF CUMBERLAND TRAILS CONFERENCE (CTC): The history of the CTC is familiar to most TTA members. In 2015 the Conference was reorganized into a nonprofit 501(e)(3) corporation. The purpose of the corporation remains as before, to construct, support and promote the Cumberland Trail project in East Tennessee, through the efforts of paid employees and volunteers and funds raised from private and non-Tennessee State Parks sources.

PROJECT DESCRIPTION:. After a long hiatus, the Cumberland Trails Conference reestablished its Big Dig trail-building program in the fall of 2015. The project is to be repeated this year. The work will be directed by a senior trail building assistant, 2 additional paid part-time staff members and a number of volunteers. (Last year there were from 8 or ten to as many as 18 volunteers on a given day). The construction effort will again be devoted to work along Daddy's Creek north of Crab Orchard, TN. Lodging and meals will be provided for staff and volunteers over the course of two Big Digs (May 4-June 11 and September 14-October 22, 2016). Funds are required for staff wages, food and lodging, and fuel, maintenance and spare treads for equipment (Ditch Witch). Estimated cost is \$40,130.

WILL OTHER GROUPS BE INVOLVED?: Yes, a modest amount of work will be provided by Cumberland Trail State Park rangers, primarily some trail marking and flagging by ranger Anthony Jones.

OTHER FUNDING SOURCES; The CTC has an organized fund raising effort in support of the 2016 Big Dig. In addition to TTA, grant applications are being made to Middle Tennessee Natural Gas, Wild Trails, American Hiking Society, Community Foundation of Greater Chattanooga, Rock Creck Outfitters, Smokey Mt. Hiking Club, Keen Effect, REI, Cumberland County Bank, and local County Governments (County Commissions). Grant requests fall in the range of \$500 to \$5,000. The 2016 goal for total Big Dig funding is \$20,000 to \$25,000.



Cumberland Trail Conference hosted its 19th annual *Alternative Spring Break* program. The CTC is a host organization for Break Away®: the Alternative Break Connection, Inc. a national 501(c)(3) nonprofit organization that supports the development of quality alternative break programs by providing training and information primarily to colleges, universities, and nonprofit organizations interested in creating lifelong active citizens through these intensive service-learning programs. The 2015 *BreakAway* had two main goals: 1.) Provide a positive experience for participants, showcasing the Cumberland Trail experience and the volunteerism that is building this trail, and 2.) complete as much sustainable and high quality trail as possible in the Graysville Mountain Recreational Management Unit.



This final week students arrived on Saturday so they got an extra work day during a near perfect weather week to complete 2550 feet of trail.

In summary: Fort Bluff Camp in Dayton proved to be an ideal base camp by providing the needed accommodations, meals, gym, meeting rooms and close access to the trail. 40 students donating 1,395 hours, 672 volunteers' hours, along with park rangers accomplished ¾ of a mile of newly constructed trail that has been blazed, GPS information gathered, and website information updated. The cost of this year's program, \$16,405.52, was offset with the grant funds we received from TTA Evans Means, Middle Tenn. Natural Gas Project Hometown Help, individual donations and student fees, totaling \$12,800, we were able to host a very successful program again this year. Thank you!

Dear Justin,

I wanted to update you on our 2016 trail building activities and the recent success of Cumberland Trails Conference's (CTC) BreakAway 2016 program. These activities, in the central and southern Justin P. Wilson Cumberland Trail State Park (CTSP) corridor, are partially funded by current Justin P. Wilson grant funds as administered by our sister organization Tennessee Trails Association, supporting both the Central Trail Crew and BreakAway Alternative Spring Break (ASB) 2016.

BreakAway 2016 was hosted in Rhea County for 2016 on two lengths of trail: a 1.6 mile stretch on Graysville Mountain and a 3.6 mile corridor within McGill Creek Gorge. These tasks were assigned to the Central and Southern Trail Crews (which began work in January), and to BreakAway 2016, our 20th year, which was held March 6 – April 2 at Fort Bluff Camp above the community of Dayton, TN. We are thrilled with the results and participation in BreakAway this year, see attached summary. The program completed 2.3 miles of trail utilizing the volunteer labor of 12 ASB schools, 154 students, totaling 4,217 trail hours. These students were supported by 1,535 CTC Volunteers hour and 445 Southern and Central Trail Crew hours. The students rose each day to the difficult task of trail building amazing us with their leadership, enthusiasm, and youth. They experienced numerous environmental and conservation educational opportunities both on the trail and in evening classes, learned critical team building skills, and made lasting friendships. We look forward to the challenges of BreakAway 2017 and all that we will accomplish.

The Central Trail Crew is now back to work after assisting with BreakAway during March, this team is working to complete their initial 7.3 mile trail corridor begun last fall on Daddy's Creek north of Crab Orchard, TN, with 5.0 miles now complete and open to hiking. The crew/volunteer team's success has allowed the Board to make a new trail commitment, the 8.0 miles historic build from Devil's Breakfast table south to Antioch Bridge (the end of the current project) within TWRA's Catoosa Wildlife Management Area. Design for this new segment is now underway with anticipated construction beginning mid-summer 2016.

Other News:

- Trail Construction Planning and Design...to improve our efficiency and lead times on future projects and their design needs, CTC's trail leadership met with Bob Fulcher, CTSP State Parks Manager, in March to complete advanced planning on our future trail commitments for the southern and central trail crews.
- The Southern Trail Crew...with BreakAway now behind them and armed with an increased CTC's budget
 commitment providing for three team members at all times, is now ramping up for the spring/summer building
 season. Supported daily with community volunteers, they are now constructing 5-days per week to complete
 the balance of the McGill Creek Gorge corridor. CTC builds the highest standards of trail, and recent
 construction during the ASB program tested our rock and trail teams, but we are thrilled with the results of this
 work.
- Spring Big Dig...will again be hosted at Eden Ridge Camp in Crab Orchard, TN from May 4th thru June 11th and will create volunteer energy for the Central Crew.
- Gator Bridge...Gator Bridge presented the completed design for the Cumberland Trail Bridge, a proprietary
 design Gator will attempt to rollout corridor wide. The design, partially funded with CTC dollars, will create a
 mobile 20-60' footbridge design for the 40+ back country bridge sites. This all aluminum design has met or
 exceeded our specs and will provide 30-50 years of life, a critical achievement to reduce the program's longterm maintenance needs.
- Connector Program...the contract between CTC and University of Tennessee at Chattanooga is in place to
 complete the extensive Connector Program work to establish, study, and rank the extensive east and west
 connectors to the Cumberland Trail and associated State Park. We are now organizing the 8-10 field teams to
 support the work. Our initial field team orientation and educational meeting is now scheduled for early May in
 Oak Ridge, TN.

We continue to appreciate your support and leadership on acquiring and building the Cumberland Trail State Park. It is a project that is just now laying the groundwork for the extensive conservation and recreation work yet to come, while providing recreational opportunities for our kids...today. I am always available to answer any questions or concerns you might have.

Budget Report: 1st Quarter Budget Report submitted online and printed in President's possession. Report approved.

 Jim Poteet discussed adding life memberships to report in order to note that \$20,750.00 cannot be spent but recognized in the report.

Membership Report: Family memberships are increasing. They have recently grown from 96 to 118. At least one person a day asks to join our Facebook page and membership is growing again.

Chapter Reports: Rosemary Marshall made a verbal report. She reports that Jacobs Engineering from Oak Ridge contacted her to get Hiking Safety Materials for their Safety Week. She supplied TTA material for Hiking Safety Day on 05-04-16. All other reports submitted via email.

Grants and Projects: Bob Richards reported that CTC requested a Grant from TTA, Evan Means Grant for the upcoming Big Dig. The amount requested was for \$2500.00 to cover transportation expenses for the Ditch Witch to include fuel spare tracks, and to stock replacement parts. That total came to approximately \$1500.00. The other \$1000.00 would be to cover further unspecified Big dig expenses. Motion to approve-Sara Pollard, 2nd-Donna Pyers. The Board requested from Rob Weber that future requests detail all expenses to be noted so all questions are answered via the Grant request. Motion carried.

CTC Update: Rob Weber updated us on the Spring Breakaway. The TTA/Justin P. Wilson Grant, student revenues, money from the 2015 TTA Annual Meeting is projected to cover the \$60.00.000 spent this year.

- 7.2 miles of trails will be finished by June as a result and the last 2-3 miles are in various stages of completion.
- The next project will be 8.2 miles along the Obed Wild and Scenic River area. This will be a difficult task as no machinery can be used.
- Motion was made to allocate the remaining \$50,000.00 from the Ann Potter Wilson Foundation donation to the CTC. Motion Bob Richards-2nd Bruce Whitehead. Motion carried.

Bob Richards updated us on the Gator Bridge Porject. He announced the prefab bridge has been designed and will last approximately 50 years. The Company is even going to install the Pilot Bridge which might be McGill Creek near Dayton.

Bruce Whitehead gave a By-laws update. He stated that due to distances between committee members, progress was slow. Carolyn Miller provided a solution using a conference call option that she has. Bruce will explore this and hopefully start back on track using this method. Jim Poteet expressed concerns for a template by-law system that was sent to the members and suggested areas we should be concerned with. This will be addressed in upcoming discussions. Since there were concerns that the Oct. 2016 Annual Meeting would be hard to get the revisions done, the target date for completion was set back to October 2017.

Membership Directory: The Directory will be ready as of 6-01-16. Members can decide on email or mailed version of it. Due to the cost of approximately \$1.00 for postage for each newsletter, it was suggested that Chapter Chairs receive them and distribute them or they can be distributed at the Annual Meeting.

Annual Meeing Update: Charlie Bright could not attend meeting due to home flooding issues. Everything is on track so far. The issue of the Auction as a fund raiser was discussed. Should we have one or not? It was decided to consult with Charlie and decide later. One suggestion was to continue the silent auction and have members make donations rather than bid in an auction.

National Trails Day: This year it is June 4,2016. Bob Richards asked the TTA to consider sponsoring for the Tennessee Greenways and Trails. He was asked to make sure any proposal be written and a dollar figure enumerated. A suggestion was also made to make this a budget item in the future.




