Trails Association members are invited to join with the Smoky Mountains Hiking Club for a hike in Frozen Head State Park Sunday, Apr. 9. The hike will start at 9 a.m. EST from the Ranger's residence. The lunch stop will be at Chimney Rock, where there is a spectacular view. The return trip will be via Fart Fields. Some early wildflowers should be in bloom.

Pres. Donald Todd has called a TTA Board meeting immediately after the kike on the 9th, around 4 p.m. at the tool shed at the Ranger's residence.

Our annual wildflower hikes will be held at Frozen Head State Park April 22 and 23. There will be both short and long hikes on Saturday, the 22nd, starting at 9 a.m. EST., and a short hike starting at 1:30 p.m. Sunday. All hikes start from the Ranger's residence. Pres. Todd says, "Bring your lunch and camera. This will probably be one of the outstanding wildflower displays in the State."

Bob plans an activity in West Tennessee in August. In September we'll go through Daddy's Creek Canyon with the Smoky Fountains Hiking Club. The fall color hike, in October, will be led by either Bob Brandt or David Gray on the John Fuir Trail.

In November we'll impose on Robbie and David Hassler to lead a hike in the Pickett area, to another Chimney Rock or to Pinnacle Mountain. The annual meeting in December will complete the year.

Joe Gaines, whom we met at the State Trails Seminar on Feb. 19, became administrator of the State Trails System Act on Farch 1. His first task has been to establish communication with people on rights of way.
