There will be discussions of State Recreation Trails under the State Trails System Act; a municipal program by John Ulmer, knoxville Mousing Authority; other State programs by the State Parks Division and Division of Forestry; and Bowaters! private indistry program.

Sunday morning, TTA President David Rhyne will give a construction demonstration of techniques used on Bowaters packet wilderness trails. The Seminar will adjourn at noon.
