The Nashville Chapter hike June 11 will be Dismals Wonder Garden in Alabama. Turn off U. S. 43 at sign nine miles south of Russellville. The 5-mile trail passes unusual geological formations, trees normally found in the Northeast and Canada, including the largest hemlock east of the Mississippi; waterfalls and a natural swimming pool. Meet at 10:30 a.m. CDT at the entrance. Admission, \$2 for adults; tent camping, \$2; hookups, \$4. Call Evelyn Tretter, 859-0566, to arrange carpools.

Charlotte and Ott Ellis will lead the June 25 hike across the Higlands of Roan, which the Southern Appalachian Highlands Conservancy hopes to buy to preserve their natural beauty. The plan is to leave Carver's Gap at 8:00 a.m. EDT and follow the Appalachian Trail over the crest of the rhododendroncovered balds to U. S. Highway 19E. A car camp Friday night at Roan Mountain State Park will help get an early start. A car shuttle will be arranged.

Charlotte writes, "The views are spectaculer and the rhododendron should be in full bloom. Take raingear, lunch, sunglasses and sunburn lotion. Anyone who wants to spend Saturday night at our house in Kingsport is welcome."

We have good news this month. Mr. A. E. Funk, Jr., general manager for American Association Limited, has given TTA permission to locate and mark the Cumberland Trail across American Association lands between Cumberland Gap and Childress Gap, a distance of some 20 miles. Mr. Funk gave permission to John McIntyre for the Cumberland Trail around 1969 and that permission was

renewed May 6, 1977.

There was a good turnout for the Savage Gulf hike May 14. (Leader Bob Richards says 26; Evelyn reports 27.) Bob writes: "We hiked about 8 miles and saw several large trees (3 to 4 feet in diameter) and several good views of Savage Gulf, but did not get down into the Gulf 1tsolf."
