BETTY BRANCH, BIG SOUTH FORK NATIONAL R.R.A. (Scott County) 1 January 1983

CANE CREEK TRAIL OVERNIGHTER (VAN BUREN CO.) Saturday-Sunday, 29-30 January, 1983

Grab your long johns and join us at Fall Creek Falls State Park for a moderately difficult winter overnighter on the Cumberland Plateau. The hike will be approximately 12 miles, five on Saturday and seven on Sunday. The weather in January on the Plateau is raw and unforgiving so layer up warmly. Bring lots of carbos and quick energy foods to provide warmth and energy, and several water bottles to keep hydrated. We will be on the Lower Loop of the Cane Creek Overnight Trail which goes down into Cane Creek Gulf, and passes by Piney Creek Falls, Fall Creek Falls (highest east of the Rockies), and Cane Creek Falls. The Gulf is magnificent in winter with many large Eastern Hemlock, a-d the frozen falls are unforgettable. Don't forget your camera. Meet at 9:30a.m. Central time in the Nature Center at Fall Creek Falls State Park.

Twin Forks Trail Worktrip - November 20, 1982 (Murfreesboro Chapter) - A great day for working on the Chapter's Adopt-A-Trail. Much was accomplished to everyone's surprise: blazed 1 mile; cut back a blackberry thicket; foot logs placed; general trail maintenance. One mile down and 21 to go!

Chickasaw Bluff Trail, November 27 (Memphis Chapter) - The rains poured over West TN the entire month of November and most of December, but it didn't stop the Memphis Chapter from our second annual Thanksgiving Day hike at Shelby Forest State Park. Fourteen well prepared hikers trekked across the Chickasaw Bluff Trail in the pouring precipitation and had a wonderful time. Leader Charlie Norvell discussed many interesting points along the way while Valerie Lewis' bouncy dog kept everyone in single file and herded us like sheep. At the end of the ten miles, we were "well damped" but happy to have our Thanksgiving Day hike together again.

Mousetail Landing, Perry County December 4 (Memphis Chapter). All of the rain during the past week must have kept Memphians at home. Jim Keeton, ranger at Mousetail, and Charlotte Zerfoss, however, decided the opportunity was too good to pass up. Mousetail Landing is the site of a new 1100 acre state rustic park. Existing facilities include new asphalt entrance road, visitor's center, ranger's residence, maintenance building and camping pads. The park will open sometime next year. The bluffs overlooking the

Tennessee River offer views of the National Wildlife Refuge. Two backpacking shelters will give hikers an ideal outdoor camping experience. If this trip is scheduled again, we hope everyone will come.




