The Nature Conservancy will be constructing a large gate at Hubbard's Cave Preserve during July and August and lots of volunteers are needed. The gate will protect colonies of two federal endangered species -- gray bats and Indiana bats -- which hibernate in Hubbard's Cave from vandalism and disturbance. Construction will begin the weekend of July 12-14 and continue each weekend until August 11.

The gate MUST be completed before the bats return to the cave for the

Many volunteers will be needed for a wide variety of tasks -- from serving food to mixing cement. Special equipment TNC needs for the project include: 4-wheel drive vehicles, cement mixers, 6 x 10' or 8 x 12' trailers to carry equipment, and a large tent to cover the work area.

MY DITTY BAG

I have a little-stuff bag which I take on all hikes, whether or not overnight. It goes year round and is a handy place to carry all the small, loose stuff you are not supposed to forget.

For example, I carry a spare flashlight bulb and (sometimes) spare batteries. Talk about spares, I have clevis pins and split rings for my frame pack, a spare fuel cap for my stove, and spare matches.

I need those matches to light two the types of fire starters I carry in the ditty bag. My compass and some waterproofed, mini instructions are also carried. (Remember, Pat Anderson, I'm the guy who forgot the red end of the needle pointed north.)

And I carry an ace bandage for downhill knee. Seasonally, the bag holds my snake bite kit, insect repellant and sun screen.

Normally it has a thermometer in it (to justify my bragging about how cold it got). And I can find my flashlight at dusk there in that small bag. The ripstop repair tape and sewing kit go along, and I hope to never have to use them again. Down in the bottom of the bag are twist ties and rubber bands.

This little nylon bag was once waterproof, but the coating has mostly worn off. It closes with a drawstring that has a cord lock attached. It was once bright red, but expect to give it up soon.

Do you have a ditty bag? If not, I recommend you consider it.
