


# TENNESSEE TRAILS

## Dear Friends,

This spring I will take steps to accomplish a dream to hike the 2,100 miles of the Appalachian Trail. On the first of March I will leave Springer Mountain, Georgia, and arrive at Mt. Katahdin in Maine by mid-August. My purpose is threefold: First, the hike will symbolize the connection between my life in the South, where I have lived for the past 25 years, to my native land in New England. Second, I will research and write about accessible sections of the trail where teachers and parents can take their students for authentic geography lessons related to the Geography Standards. As part of my own search for health, I have grown accustomed to hiking long distances while backpacking with my children, as a scout leader, and with my Knox County inner city students as a former Knox County teacher. Third, and most important, I will use this hike to raise money for breast cancer research. This third goal is where you come in. I imagine that you, like me, have seen an increasing number of colleagues, family, and friends stricken with breast cancer. This fall as I teach at Volunteer State Community College and Tennessee Technological University and in the Upper Cumberland, I am again reminded that breast cancer strikes women of all ages, in all cultures, and of all regions. My grief for their suffering, coupled with an awareness of my risk as a 43 year old woman, grateful for good health, has led me to make this

commitment to breast cancer research. I invite you to sponsor my steps on the Appalachian Trail as part of the stride toward women's health and healing by donating to breast cancer research.

## TRIP REPORTS, NEWS AND NOTES

### EAST TENNESSEE

*CUMBERLAND TRAIL - BRADY MOUNTAIN  
DECEMBER 28, 1996, HAROLD DRAPER*

Eight members signed up on a warm Saturday after Christmas for an adventure in mist and mud in the Cumberland Mountains. The most exciting part of the trip, for drivers and riders alike, was the tedious 4-mile drive down a muddy, boulder-strewn county road to the trailhead. Although the promised views of Grassy Cove Karst National Natural Landmark did not materialize because of dense fog, it was evident that we were on a mountain top because of sharp dropoffs into the fog. One view of the Cumberland Homesteads area did reveal itself near the end of the hike, and hikers were treated to interesting rock formations on the ridge. All hikers were impressed with the well-marked and well-maintained trail (maintenance provided by the Plateau Chapter of TTA). While the drivers tried to extract three cars from the mud and rocks of Jewett Road, participants enjoyed an hour of shopping at the Cumberland General Store, which stocks "goods in endless variety for man and beast."

### ***BACON RIDGE TRIP REPORT - DON COFFMAN***

On January 18<sup>th</sup>, when other groups were calling off hikes because of low wind chill numbers, eight brave hikers tackled Bowaters' latest offering to the public, Bacon Ridge Trail south of the river in Roane County. This is an environmental education as well as an excellent recreational trail. New member Stan Malone, who laid the trail out, gave us the natural history of the area, which includes the open pit iron mining operation which ended over 60 years ago. He explained how Bowaters uses the land for a renewable resource, pulp wood. After a steady and warming climb to the ridge top, we stopped for a quick lunch and admired the view of the mountains; to the east Chilhowee Mountain and the Smokies; to the southeast and south the Unicoi Mountains of Cherokee National Forest and Chilhowee Mountain when it appears again. ### MURFREESBORO
